Bird News

Most of our songbirds were still singing at the beginning of the month but by the 24th I was only hearing Greenfinches and a few snatches of song from Blackcaps.

Most small birds are now moulting and are not very visible.

A flock of 25 Linnets early in the month by Wemberham Lane was unusual as was a pair in a garden in Duck Lane, Kenn.

Later in the month. Duck Lane also hosted up to 40 Swallows on the wires.

A Swallow roost developed at Stowell's Reed beds with a maximum of about 70 birds visible from Wemberham Lane. On one evening a couple of Swifts joined the pre roost feeding frenzy.

These roosts seem to happen following hot weather and are comprised mostly of young birds. A bigger roost might occur in August.

Peregrines were observed at Clevedon, Congresbury where one was seen to stoop into gardens probably after a Pigeon, and a juvenile on a pylon near Worle railway station was calling incessantly for at least 45 minutes.

I have only received one Kingfisher sighting from the Little River at Yatton.

A Wheatear at Sand Point was an early returning migrant and hopefully a portent of things to come.

A Yellowhammer was an encouraging sighting at Backwell Common and a Tawny Owl likewise by the Strawberry Line near Congresbury.

Nearby three Cattle Egrets were feeding in a field.

Our Monthly Missive from The Limes

Death has a way of changing one's plans. I was going to tell you why I am scrapping my solar panels but that will have to wait for another time.

Last Saturday afternoon Chris Holloway died and I want to dedicate this month's writing as a tribute to him.

Some of you will not know who Chris was. Although a resident of Yatton he spent a lot of time in Kenn and you would see him sometimes at village events.

However you are more likely to know him through his stunning photographs of local views which appeared in KN&V from time to time, many of them of Kenn Moor or the Limes. He was an avid photographer and only a few weeks ago was taking pictures of my front garden as according to him, the "lighting was right".

You may also have come across him on social media, especially on Yatton groups. On them he could be forthright but honest and he expressed commonsense views. Sometimes he could annoy people, especially in local wildlife groups when he challenged irrational comments or excesses that others had posted.

He got banned more than once but was always reinstated after public clamour supported him and sense prevailed.

As a person Chris could be described as a real gent. He had principles and he would defend them. He would stick up for people and although I never knew him to have grudges, those grudges that he did have were well hidden to most of us.

He was the sort of person who could call a spade a spade without offending anyone, although he did come close when he said to me "Peppa is a better writer than her master!"

Chris was a very affable person and would talk to anyone. He liked people and would help anybody. When he worked at Barrow Gurney hospital (he was an electrician) on one occasion he got talking to a patient who confessed that he had never learned to write his name. Over a period of time Chris spent his spare time with him until he could write his own signature.

More recently most of us knew Chris either for his walking or for his bowls but over the years he had other interests.

Let's start with cycling. As a teenager, probably aged 14 or 15, his mother had trouble getting him out of bed in the morning until a workmate introduced Chris to cycling. His mother was then shocked when he would get up at 4am in the morning to go racing! It was a hobby he kept for many years and made many friends through it. He was even a member of a worldwide octogenarian cycle group! What they talked about beats me.

He was a cycling champion. He won a Welsh National competition and was a runner up in the Great Britain All Rounder Competition. He also designed his own bicycle and had it made in Bristol. He carried on cycling into his 50's and then on one cycling event suddenly realised he was no longer enjoying it and stopped on the spot. Wanting something not competitive he took up mountain walking and became a walks leader for HF Holidays and Ramblers Holidays, leading walks all over the world, including the Continent and Nepal.

I think his gentle personality and common sense and confidence made him the ideal leader for these events. He could be firm but his manner with problem people would be to take someone to one side and have a quiet word and that sorted things out.

Through his leadership of walks he made friends from all over the world, some of whom he and Jean would visit in later years.

Jean introduced Chris to long distance walking and together they "did" most of the UK long distance footpaths. The last major one was Lands' End to John O'Groats which was completed when Chris was 80.

For many years Chris belonged to Bristol Ramblers and Yatton Ramblers and his idea of a Sunday was 18 miles with Bristol Ramblers. In the summer months, when Jean was still working and Chris was retired, he would walk with her along the river to her office near Strode Road, walk back here to collect his car so by 10am he had done 8 miles!

Chris was always interested in photography (and always seemed to be buying kit!) I remember when he became interested in wildlife photography and flower photography and was taking pictures of my bees on crocuses – which of course came out better than mine. I remember him preparing sites for bird photography. I learned that most bird photographs are as a result of baiting a site with some sort of food and so for a time all sorts of branches and twigs appeared by my garage with titbits stuck in them!

About 12 years ago Chris took up bowls and introduced Jean to the game. He became a very competent player and made many friends who are now a great support for Jean. It ended up being an all year round hobby as in winter you play indoor bowls until the weather improves.

Chris was born in 1937 and became an electrician. He moved to the South West when he was in his late teens or early twenties and ended up in Yatton. His last job was with the NHS and it was during a routine X-ray in his 60's they discovered Chris had a hole in his heart. Of course that had always been there and it is remarkable how much he had achieved despite the condition. Anyway it was operated on and that led to having a pacemaker and the start of many visits to BRI over the years. It also caused him to retire early due to ill health.

It was Chris who I alluded to in one of my articles who had his pacemaker due for its regular change recently and ended up being surrounded by a bevy of nurses as the doctors tried to juggle the wires which were being obstinate. I never found out if the presence of these nurses made him feel better or not. However he did have a high respect for the Bristol heart unit and their care and frequent tweaking of his pacemakers allowed him to continue an active life until recently.

Chris leaves behind a daughter and two sons and a very large hole in many people's lives. As Jean told me, "He led a very full and interesting life."

Chris Holloway 8th March 1937 to 19th July 2025. (Aged 88). The village flag was flown at half-mast on 22nd July in his memory. At the time of writing we have no date for his funeral.

We're seeing multiple reports of people receiving texts, many claiming to be from the Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) or other 'official' departments, encouraging them to apply for the Winter Heating Allowance or other 'energy allowances' before an upcoming deadline. Wording may vary, but texts might be similar to the example below.

These texts are fraudulent. Clicking the link will take you to a fake website, which may look like an official Government site. It's designed to steal your personal information and potentially access your bank account.

Government communications will never ask you for personal information via text or email. Most people will get the Winter Fuel Payment automatically if they are eligible.

If you receive unsolicited content like this or any other texts you don't trust:

- ? Stop! Think Fraud and don't click on any links
- Take your time to read any unexpected messages.

 There are often signs to indicate fraud, such as spelling and grammar errors or strange use of language

Forward the SPAM message to 7726 free of charge so your mobile phone provider can investigate

If you have become a victim and have lost money notify your bank immediately, by calling 159. Also report to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040

SCAM WARNING — WINTER FUEL ALLOWANCE

Be aware that there is a scam about the Winter Fuel Allowance.

You WILL NOT be contacted by text or telephone to ask you to apply. It will be paid automatically.

This is a scam to get hold of your bank details.

I think there are a lot of vulnerable people about and they should be warned....



Update from Tessa Munt, MP for Kenn

Thank you to those who came to my surgery at the Disati Café.

It's good to know what matters to you.

In Westminster, I spoke about speeding in rural areas in a debate. I know this affects many of you and it's so frustrating that often laws exist, can be used, but there are no Police to take action when laws are broken.

I'm concerned about speeding and will continue to press for stronger action. Thank you if you've contacted me about this.



In Parliament over the last month, I've spoken about:

- * use by the NHS of different computer software systems even in departments in the same hospital which can't 'talk' to each other, therefore compromising patient safety and care
- * water safety and the need for everyone to learn to swim
- * the fifth anniversary of the Covid-19 outbreak
- * management of the contract for electronic tagging of prisoners
- * the few excluded from the Government's Infected Blood Compensation Scheme all matters which you tell me are important to you.

I write to each Minister to request they take whatever action is needed.

I'll be running lots of 'surgeries' over the summer, so feel free to come along.

The full list is available if you call or email me. I'm always happy to hear what matters to you, whether it's a local, national or global issue.

My next regular 'surgery' dates are:

Community Governance Review 2025 (CGR)

A Community Governance Review is an opportunity for North Somerset Council to review and make changes to the governance in their area. They use it to make sure that governance arrangements are working as efficiently and effectively as possible.

They involve the public, town/parish councils, other interested parties, asking them if they feel their communities are suitably represented. They are required to consult with

- local government electors living in the North Somerset District
- any other individuals and organisations who 'appear to have an interest in the review'

And must consider all representations we receive during the review's periods of consultation. It will make all representations available for public viewing.

The first consultation is closed and the second public consultation (interested parties can have their say on the draft recommendations). This second round of public consultation will open on Monday 1 September and close at midnight on Friday 31 October.
