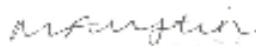

Beavers in North Somerset.

With the news that Beavers have been found in Blagdon Lake, almost certainly as a result of illegal unlicensed release, experience elsewhere means it probably won't be that long before they show up locally.

The Blagdon lake outflows into the Congresbury Yeo that reaches the Severn estuary at Tutshill Sluice Kingston Seymour, in addition much of the Rhine system in Kingston and Kenn is kept filled in summer with water from the Yeo.

You may be excited to see these creatures in a waterway near you but they are likely to cause considerable problems in our lowland managed countryside.

They are animals best suited to wilderness areas and even though they were once native here, like Bears and Wolves, there is good reason they were hunted to extinction in the middle ages, not just for hats but as our countryside was increasingly being managed for agriculture, nature's engineers were a nuisance to the human engineers.

The obvious problems that they are already causing on the Somerset levels, where they have been in evidence for several years is blocking watercourses and burrowing into banks.

As usual, the relevant authorities are behind the curve with protocols for dealing with the financial consequences of the activities of this protected species.

The Drainage Board does have one officer who is licensed to oversee some clearing up of any dams or leaks they cause but we are asking that this be easier than the current regime that applies to badgers.

In North America where they still have wilderness, they have several measures of control, including lethal, if they get into culverts and drainage ditches.

Finally those that advocate for the reintroduction of once native species always, leave somebody else to pick up the financial consequences, so we wait to see how this develops..

Bird News

Red Kites featured again in June often but not exclusively linked with grass cutting activities. There were sightings at Yatton and Kingston Seymour as well as one on the road to Portishead which dived onto road kill in front of a car displacing a Carrion Crow in the process. Also in the Gordano Valley and seen from a car was a very large raptor almost certainly a White Tailed Eagle from the Isle of Wight reintroduction project.

The juvenile Peregrines at Weston Town Quarry were all flying strongly by early June and a juvenile observed from Wemberham Lane is likely to have been one of these. It was zooming on to the pylons seemingly showing off its flying skills. Staying with raptor news a Hobby was seen on two occasions near to the Clevedon Salerooms.

Following a blank year in 2025 Barn Owls are bouncing back. The Congresbury Moor pair have three large young and it is believed that they are nesting again. Second nests are reported as being widespread in the South West this year. But bucking the trend a pair at Kingston Seymour only started nesting at the beginning of June.

Kestrels also had three young on Congresbury Moor.

Swifts were late arriving and I didn't see one locally until early June. There were nine over Congresbury Moor on the 8th.

A survey along the sea wall at Kingston Seymour was only notable for 100+ Shelduck including a female with half a dozen ducklings, and 20 Oystercatchers. Four Shelduck were with gulls on a large field at Wemberham. Also at Wemberham there were several Skylarks singing and at least two pairs of Linnets.

A Buzzard captured a small mammal and flew to a nearby hedge and this prompted a Lesser Whitethroat to start singing.

July is generally a quiet month for birds as nesting is replaced by moult so any local sightings will be much appreciated..

Update from Tessa Munt, MP for Kenn



Hello everyone, It's been another busy month here and in Westminster.

Locally, David and I had a brilliant time at YATT-Fest. It was lovely to speak to so many people, meet Mike and Zoe from Avon & Somerset Police; serve cider with Tom and Henry in the Thatchers' horsebox bar; and help Virginia's team in the Strawberry Line Café & Community Cycle Hire tent.

David and I also had the pleasure of joining the celebration for Yatton & Congresbury Wildlife

Action Group (YACWAG)'s new acquisition – a large piece of land where YACWAG plans to protect wildlife.

In Westminster, I asked questions about:

- * the low mileage rates paid to those undertaking Jury Service
- * Councils losing income from recycling their aluminium
- * potential breaches of export trade regulations for waste tyres
- * huge business rate hikes for rural micro and small businesses
- * when and by whom the records relating to the June 1994 Chinook air crash were sealed for 100 years
- * long delays to the compensation scheme for victims of the medical 'mesh' scandal
- * whether new training to increase the understanding of state threats for the Police should be extended to 'front line' health, job centre and social services staff as well
- * the legacy of the Northern Ireland 'Troubles' Bill
- * habitual waste of NHS expertise, resources, time and taxpayers' money providing unsuitable wheelchairs for patients which then have to be replaced.
