## BIRD NEWS

January has been Owl month with lots of reports of four species, a record for this column I think. There have been some interesting sightings from Kenn residents so please do keep it up, it's your magazine.

Starting with Barn Owls, Rob Treble saw one at Kenn Pier (and also a Water Rail for good measure). Julia Bush saw one along Claverham Drove and heard a Little Owl in Kenn Street. The 'YACWAG' Barn Owls, up to three have been seen out in the daytime by the Strawberry Line on one occasion in bright sun at midday.

Unfortunately this suggests that prey is scarce, perhaps the very wet Autumn reduced the vole numbers. The Owls are favouring fields left fallow awaiting development.

Also by the Strawberry Line two Short Eared Owls were being harassed by the resident Kestrel on a fallow field by the Gang Wall. Another Short Eared Owl was on Kenn Moor spotted by John Croxton. These birds may have moved from the snow on Mendip or from further north.

To complete the Owl records a Tawny was seen by the crossroads on Kenn Moor Road.

Kingfishers have also been widely reported. One at Manmoor Bridge was spotted by Rob Treble, others were on the Little River, the ditch by Ham Lane and one flashed in front of me from Stowell's in Wemberham Lane. Rob also noted Great and Little Egret at Manmoor with Goosander, four Little Grebes, a pair of Stonechats and a Goldcrest there.

Later in the month Steve Edwards flushed Woodcocks in Duck Lane and by Kenn Court and whilst cleaning nestboxes in Littlewood the volunteers flushed two. There seems to be a few more Woodcock around this winter.

From Woodcocks to Peregrines or at least one Peregrine. A small male, probably a juvenile has taken to the T pylons. After a gap of about nine months without Peregrines this bird has been using the pylons as a look out from Congresbury Moor, Wemberham, Kingston Seymour to Kenn Moor.

Winter thrushes have been in low numbers this winter so a flock of over a hundred on Kenn Moor seen by John Croxton was very notable. A singing Mistle Thrush was with them and another, calling not singing, in the car park at the Bridge Inn.

## Our Missive from the Limes

Did you know that if you have hearing loss and don't get it addressed your brain may shrink?

This is the third attempt to get an article suitable for the esteemed readers of KN&V. This month I had let Peppa write something. Unfortunately I think as she is getting older her memory is not what it was and our editor had to point out that Peppa had said broadly the same thing last May. Oops! Our editor is a scary bright lady.

However as the buck has to stop somewhere I said I'd prepare something else for this month. In fact I had a topic in mind for March so you have got this a month early. By the way if you can't remember what Peppa did say in May – and nor could I – I'm sure that for a suitable consideration our editor would enlighten you. I haven't yet told Peppa that her article has been bounced – I will choose my moment.

Some time ago – December 2021 to be precise - I wrote about cataracts. I understand the article was "helpful". In the spirit of addressing topics that might affect the majority of us at some stage I thought I would discuss hearing and hearing loss. Perhaps in time I could work my way round the other senses and also include teeth. We'll see.

I have reached the age where, when meeting with friends, items of a medical nature crop up from time to time. So far we have avoided comparing prostates but recently we have discussed both pacemakers and hearing aids. One of our group has recently had a pacemaker fitted so we heard details such as making pouches in one's chest, the pain and so on. A friend's wife has also had one fitted and someone else we know has had his changed. That one took well over twice as long as expected, they kept him awake during it and the only consolation appeared to be 3 consultants all having a go and the presence of a bevy of nurses. Whether that made it more tolerable I don't know.

For many years I have struggled with some aspects of hearing. I'm not silly when it comes to protecting my hearing and I do use ear plugs or ear muffs if needed. For example if I am mowing the grass I wear ear defenders. I'm aware that my father's hearing was very poor in later life but he worked in an industrial research lab where in those days hearing protection was just not considered. I also have a friend who played drums as a teenager and now in her 40's has to have hearing aids. Hearing is precious so we must treat our ears carefully.

I don't have anyone to nag me to get my hearing checked – I have to be self-motivated on everything - but I was having problems in hearing speech in films, especially American films (not that I watch many), and in hearing the lyrics on songs – not that many of them are worth hearing anyway. Otherwise I thought my hearing wasn't too bad. However I thought it was worth getting it checked and at least I could share my experiences with you (the things I do for KN&V), although I know many of you are ahead of me and trod the path before me.

Clearly the first step in addressing hearing problems is to get a hearing test and possibly getting any ear wax removed. Sadly the latter is not usually done at the doctors nowadays and you have to go elsewhere and pay.



In the past you had to have a doctor's referral to get a hearing test (for NHS). That is no longer true. The big providers (Boots, Specsavers are the main ones) let you self-refer. There are also a number of smaller providers in the market and some of them also accept self-referrals.

You can get hearing aids on the NHS which are free or you can go privately. The latter can cost you up to £3000 for a pair so is not cheap. The upside is that you are meant to get a better customer service and the latest hearing aids and features. The downside is that the NHS hearing aids have largely caught up and in my opinion, unless you have particular requirements, there is not a lot between them. Others may have different views.

In either case a hearing test will show up which part of your hearing is weak. A word of warning here. I know there are at least two providers who run clinics at the cottage hospital. From experience I'll say be careful. Their audiologists may be good but as they are itinerant they cannot carry the specialised equipment that a dedicated centre has. For example centres have soundproofed booths for tests, whereas at the cottage hospital the listening tests compete with noise in the corridor. Unfortunately my case the audiologist was also most unhelpful and in the end I transferred to one of the high street providers and the difference in support was incredible.

Your hearing doesn't have to be particularly bad in order not to hear certain words. One thing I didn't realise was that certain syllables or character sounds use different frequencies so if those ones are weak you have problems. As we get older the higher frequencies are heard less strongly and a hearing test will work out which ones are affected and whether there any other issues.

Now for a bit of biology. Putting it in very simple terms your ear has multiple sensors which respond to different frequencies. Each sensor is connected to your brain. If some of the sensors are failing or are weak, for example from being exposed to loud noises, then the brain does not receive signals from those affected. The consequence (in simple terms) is that the part of the brain that is not receiving the signals either gets transferred into doing something else (for which it may not be suitable) or it atrophies.

That means your brain shrinks.

As I understand it, the overall effect can also ripple elsewhere and cause or exacerbate other problems – and this is in addition to the social effects from feeling excluded from conversations etc by deafness.

Unfortunately once the ear stops responding to particular sounds it cannot be repaired – the only option is to increase the stimulus in the first place as best one can, hence the hearing aid. However you don't want to amplify everything and this is where modern hearing aids are so much better than their predecessors as they can be programmed to be selective. Once the weak areas are addressed, signals will resume to parts of the brain. The brain will adapt back but it will take time, which is why audiologists say hearing aids take time to get used to. In other words don't expect an instantaneous major hearing improvement. Once set up properly it can take weeks or even months.

Now I wonder if I can get doggy hearing aids programmed to deal with Peppa's selective hearing....

2025

### **PARISH COUNCIL MEETING held on the 13 January 2025**

- **Bus Stop by Kenn Estate** – reports were received that this was a positive improvement.
- **Fisherman’s car park** – reply awaited from Environment Agency about cutting a hedge.
- **Heritage Sign** – it was considered the sign would avoid further damage and be easier to install if it was relocated to the verge near the bus stop on Kenn Road. As NSC Highways Dept own the sign so permission was needed from them to do it. A reply was awaited.
- **20mph for Kenn Street** – Next stage is NSC advertising the Traffic Regulation Order and if no objections upheld the signing changes will be made as soon as possible afterwards. <https://n-somerset.gov.uk/my-services/parking-travel-roads/roads-streets/comment-traffic-regulation-orders-tros>
- **Motorway Bridge/Pavement** – recalled the drains had been cleared but the rubbish left beside them, so concern it would go down the drain again. Pavement not cleared yet.
- **Tree Works on The Green** – some trimming will be carried out soon.
- **National Grid, Hinkley Connection Project** – representatives will be attending the Kenn Parish Council meeting in March to provide an update.
- **NSC Delivering Together Programme** – NSC were seeking financial support from Parish Councils for the Financial Year 2025-26 towards providing three areas of services:
  1. Parks and open spaces management; in particular, the maintenance of playgrounds where there are play areas in the parish overseen currently by NSC.
  2. Street cleansing; in particular the emptying of some litter bins.
  3. Public Rights of Way; management.

The two being proposed for Kenn were 2 & 3 above:

- (2) proposed the Parish Council takes over emptying 3 bins on Kenn Rd or they will be removed by NSC – a. by phone box / b. by bus shelter / c. on The Green. The Parish Council agreed to take over emptying (a) and (b) above but asked for (c) to be removed.
- (3) making a contribution of £500 towards funding a Public Rights of Way officer for NSC. The Parish Council recalled that they do not have the power or duty to spend money on a NSC’s statutory duty. A parish council can only fund repairs to footpaths.
- **Parish Council Precept for the Financial Year 2025/26** – the request for this had to be with NSC by the 27 January 25. Kenn Parish Council decided not to increase their precept and to keep it the same as for the previous year.
