Regular events include the Annual Village Lunch in the summer, a monthly Village Market (with coffee and cakes), and monthly Monday Lunch Break There is also the occasional Pop-up Bar with skittles, and much more. These events are always advertised in this Kenn 'News & Views' magazine. Additionally, the hall is regularly used by the Kenn's Women's Institute and the Kenn Parish Council.

If you want to vote in government elections, you can even do that here too!

If you're looking for both exercise and fun, the hall also hosts weekly salsa, line dancing and Sizzle's 'Keep Fit' classes.

Book the Hall for Your Own Events!

Not only can you attend events, but the hall is also available to book for your own private functions. Villagers receive preferential booking rates, making it a popular venue for family gatherings, children's parties, and hobby groups – it's really only limited by your imagination (and, of course, the booking conditions!).

Run by the Community, for the Community

The hall is managed by a committee of villagers and volunteers who dedicate their time to maintenance and improvements. Over the past few years, volunteers have replaced all the roof and wall cladding and installed insulation. If you have a skill and would like to contribute, we would love for you to join our working group!

We run the hall as a not-for-profit enterprise meaning bookings are essential to its upkeep.

Bird News

The Short Eared Owl sightings from January continued with one seen by the Strawberry Line at Yatton and another near to Mendip Spring Golf Club at Congresbury with a Red Kite for company.

Barn Owls were less evident but were spotted on a couple of occasions at Yatton.

The herd of Mute Swans totalled 57 birds on Kenn Moor early in the month and a group of 30 was on maize stubble at Wemberham.

Winter thrushes have been in short supply but 100+ were on Kenn Moor by Nailsea Wall and what was possibly the same flock at Wemberham Lane a few days later.

Congresbury Moor (on different dates) produced 50 Linnets, 30 Meadow Pipits, a Little Grebe, a Kingfisher and a Water Rail capturing and eating what may have been a crayfish from the River Yeo. A few very mobile Goosanders were present.

Greenfinches seemed abundant with a party of 25 on the Strawberry Line notable.

A few Siskins and a single Redpoll were also noted there.

The milder weather from the 20th precipitated an increase in song with Cetti's Warblers tuning up along with Chaffinches that were a few days later than average.

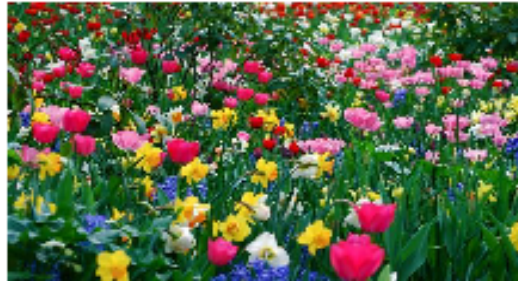

Our Missive from the Limes
